Ricardo A. Anzaldúa is the executive vice president and general counsel of Freddie Mac. In his role as principal legal counsel, Anzaldúa oversees all legal and regulatory strategies, services and resources, and manages all corporate governance matters.

Before joining Freddie Mac, Anzaldúa was executive vice president and general counsel of MetLife, Inc., where, from 2012 to 2017, he was responsible for the company's global legal operations, global compliance and government relations. Anzaldúa began his legal career at the law firm of Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen & Hamilton LLP, where he was named partner in 1999.

He earned his law degree from Harvard Law School and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Brown University, where he studied development economics and Latin American history.
